Allen (Dutch) C. Shaw, 85, a resident Corpus Christi, Texas passed away Friday, December 23, 2022, after a hard fight with Dementia.

He was born on March 14, 1937, in Kenedy, Texas to the late Joe L. Shaw and Jarrell Church Kelley.

He graduated from Robstown High School in 1954. Immediately after graduation, he joined the U.S. Army, traveling to Sasebo, Japan. He served his country until 1957.
